

MESSAGE FROM THE EDITORIAL BOARD

Dear colleagues and friends,

The content of this newsletter will allow you to enter and participate in the associative life, as well as our association's actions and projects.

I would like to thank the entire "Weavings" working group, in particular the editorial secretaries, Diana Hidalgo and Luisa Moi.

There are numerous scientific and administrative developments that we would like to convey to you, which will be announced in part by Anna Nicolo, president of the IACFP.

The convocation of an Extraordinary General Assembly will allow the association to be democratized by opening the doors to all colleagues interested in the field of couples and families. The proposal to reduce the fee for all members to €40 and for students in training to €15 will be discussed.

Another good news is the redistribution of positions on the Board of Directors, whereby young colleagues prepared to energize the present and open up to the future of our association have been appointed: a new general secretary (Sara Gonzalez de Pablos), a new treasurer (Saida Sid); and a new scientific secretary (Cristina Calarasanu).

Expanding the Scientific Council to include linguistic commissions will allow the launching of regional scientific conferences in 2024 and international congress in 2025.

The Study Center-the operational arm of the Scientific Council- has 10 international clinical and research work groups whose themes and arguments we present . We welcome 4 new groups. All groups are semi-open for members of our association who can present their candidatures by writing to the coordinator. New topics can also be proposed.

The international journals network have expanded significantly and as our work progresses, many other journals have expressed their interest. We present their latest editions.

We plan to create a pilot writing workshop in 2024 for IACFP members to collaborate in the creation of articles that help with clinical development and professional growth.

Finally, our affection and recognition to three colleagues who have been taken from us this year, Roberto Losso, Eduardo Grinspon and Olga Correa Ruiz, with whom we have shared scientific exchanges and moments of great viability.

LETTER TO IACFP MEMBERS

Dear colleagues,

I am writing to you because I would like to inform you of the intense work we have done with some members of the Board of Directors in this period, from the debut of my presidency until today.

Regrettably, in the last few months several people of great importance to our association have passed away: Roberto Losso, dean of our association and founding member, was a great clinician who delved deeply into the topics of myth and couple work. Olga Correa, a brilliant and intelligent colleague with whom I had fruitful exchanges in the past, has also passed away. Sonia Kleiman, a courageous woman, former president of the IACFP, university professor, she has studied link theory in particular and was director of training at the Italian Hospital. We also lose Eduardo Grinspon, who leaves us his depth in clinical material, his great psychotherapeutic involvement, a great thinker from many referential schemes, among them Racamier and Roussillon. We also note the absence of David Maldavsky, a professional of great creativity who developed the David Liberman Algorithm (ADL) and psychoanalytic links psychopathology. Invaluable colleagues, masters and founders of the IACFP. We will try to remember them both on our website and in the conferences we organize.

The intense work we have carried out has concerned many key points of the IACFP. First of all, it is important to define the number and the name of the members of the IACFP.

Treasurer Rosa Jaitin and assistant treasurer Saïda Sid, together with other colleagues such as Irma Morosini and our secretary, are working hard on this point.

The difficult economic situation, determined by the COVID pandemic, has forced us to reduce our expenses. We have decided to renew our website and we have chosen a Portuguese webmaster, equally brilliant but more economical. We have high expectations of him, who has just started working.

The board appointed Cristina Calarasanu as scientific secretary of the IACFP and we have decided to have 3 sub-commissions, one in English, one in French and one Spanish-Portuguese. The commission and the board will work with me to organize regional conferences to increase participation in the IACFP and to make us more and more known.

Sara González de Pablos is the new General Secretary. Two members of the Board of Directors have resigned and I invite you to send your applications to fill these two positions.

Maria Inês Assumpção Fernandes, former president of our association, will work with me as an advisor. This makes me very happy, as her presence will enrich me with her experience and knowledge.

We have decided to convene an **EXTRAORDINARY GENERAL ASSEMBLY** for next Sunday, December 17th, from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. (Italian schedule), to discuss a reduction of dues and costs to favor colleagues in your associations.

We hope that all of you will help us to resume an ever richer scientific and associative life.

Although interest in family and couple psychoanalysis is growing in many associations around the world, the IACFP remains the oldest association that allows exchanges between psychotherapists of different nationalities and languages.



TThe Study Center plays a key role in promoting academic collaboration and research, working in close partnership with universities and the scientific council.

These work groups are configured around a specific task, which is selected and defined by its members. This autonomy allows participants to address topics of common interest and relevant clinical challenges. Each group, by choosing their area of focus, contributes significantly to the research and development of best practices in their respective fields.

In addition to homework, groups are encouraged to appoint a spokesperson to serve as team coordinator. The spokesperson plays an essential role in facilitating communication and coordinating efforts within the group.

The linking psychoanalytic perspective, created by Janine Puget and Isidoro Berenstein, broadens the vision, opens the field of the possible, gives rise to the radically new.

Thought that arises from logics other than those of modernity and proposes other categories that are different and supplementary to the classic ones: such as the binding force of "between two or more", the alter and the alien, social subjectivity, discontinuities of time and space, the presentation and effects of presence, becoming other with others, interference, chance, indetermination, uncertainty, the radically new, among others.

The objective of this Clinical Theoretical Reflection Group is the study and deepening of this thinking and joint production.

The magma of social imaginary meanings regulates discourses, practices, desires and feelings, instituting the subjectivities belonging to a society at a given moment. The changes and transformations that the new realities impose on us in the ways of being, being and bonding in this 21st century, affect the couple as a social institution in continuous movement and transformation. Psychoanalysis and particularly, the linking perspective in psychoanalysis provides us with tools to rethink theories and reformulate practices, fostering experience in our clinic.

Multifamily Therapy (2019-2023)

In 2019 we started an online group on the study and reflection of multifamily groups (GMF). This group was made up of a dozen professionals (psychologists and psychiatrists) from different countries (Spain, Portugal, France and Russia), with practices in various public and private institutions that have generally little experience in this type of activity.

Meetings are bimonthly and last two hours. The work is based on the conceptualizations of J. García Badaracco who began with this therapeutic device in the scope of a psychiatric hospital in the city of Buenos Aires in 1960. The work in this modality tries to study its specificity and differentiate it from other therapeutic spaces. (group therapy, family therapy, bonding therapy, etc.) In these 4 years of existence we address theoretical and clinical aspects of the activity and continue in this line of work. The group is open to anyone who wants to join. We think we can reach 20 participants.

The group has been working for 4 years and in 2023 it begins its fifth year. It is currently consists of 15 members, having grown this year from 11 members to 15.

We aim to investigate through surveys, interviews, session material, conversations, data studies, statistics and our own personal and professional experiences, how the pandemic has affected and is still affecting us. With a Reflection Group system we will be able to ask ourselves about the various aspects that this phenomenon has presented and continues to present in the Clinic, trying to explore issues that have not been sufficiently taken into account in terms of mental health in public policies. The main idea is to be able to contribute our knowledge and provide some help to health services in the form of advice and writings, reviewing what happened and is happening to families, couples and the community in general in the various countries of the world and how better prepared to face other scourges of this class.

During the first meeting of the year, which took place last Thursday, March 30, the new members were received, a few words of remembrance for Eduardo Grinspon who died in December 2022 were shared as a farewell, organizational issues were worked on and the experience was heard. clinic regarding the Covid pandemic by Donatella Lisciotto, with exchange of ideas between everyone.

More and more institutions come into contact with families and/or members who suffer because of their symptoms. But as we all know, the institution functions as a mirror of the problems of the population it serves. In this sense, the care provided to these groups by a nursing team will have an impact on the psychological functioning of the institutional group. Based on these observations, the objective of this research is to propose an armed projective group clinic created in the psychology laboratory of the University of Franche-Comté, which allows the evaluation of these phenomena from an objective point of view, but also to initiate psychic work. group (mediation tools).

The meetings were held virtually through the Zoom platform and at the time of this presentation a total of 6 meetings had been held. In the first phase of the research, the topic of interventions and interpretations in couples therapy was defined, as well as the methodology for group work, focused on tasks and promoting free association and spontaneity of the participants. Currently, the research group is consulting bibliography on the topic, as well as sharing free association work on some texts proposed by Alberto Eiguer.

It publishes unpublished Referenced Works that are evaluated by an international tribunal of peers and Free Works, unpublished or not.

The publication frequency is semiannual.

It is open to the community linked to psychoanalysis that wishes to transmit and share its experience and thoughts, from a position that includes different theoretical lines.



PERMANENT CALL FOR PAPERS

The journal permanently receives works that refer to issues of Childhood and Adolescence, in two modalities: free works and referred works. It also receives works that respond to the dossier of each issue, announced in a timely manner.

For free jobs:

The free works cover a heterogeneous range of topics in Psychoanalysis of children and adolescents. It includes writings from various national and international theoretical-clinical lines.

For referred works:

The works must be unpublished (considering as such works not previously published in any language or format). They will be submitted to national and/or international review for anonymous evaluation, after which the authors will receive detailed information about said evaluation.

The Editorial Committee will receive the works, send them to the designated Referees and will subsequently notify of their acceptance, proposed modification or rejection.


The accepted works will be published in the next issue of the Journal or will be made available in a bank of articles ready to be published in subsequent editions, which will be reported to the authors.

INTERACTIONS JOURNAL

The basic element that inspires this Journal is the conviction that the individual is not an isolated structure and that identity and its formation are always multipersonal: the other, in short, is always present in the psychic life of the individual "and therefore "In this broader but unquestionably legitimate sense, individual psychology is at the same time, from the beginning, social psychology" (S. Freud). The other is always present in the psychic life of the individual and a fruitful source of research is the study of the interactions between the individual and the relational matrix that encompasses him.

In our opinion, the place that best allows us to study these processes is the therapeutic couple, the marital couple and the family. The focus on intrapsychic and interpersonal interactions and relationships constitutes an innovative perspective of observation and a true work methodology.

The BiViPsi integrates a database intended to preserve and disseminate the scientific production of the psychoanalytic institutions that are components of the Psychoanalytic Federation of Latin America (FEPAL) – International Psychoanalytic Association (API). It also incorporates and disseminates the publications of other external Psi Editors. It is also the only VHL (Virtual Health Library) in Argentina – and one of the first instances in Latin America – to implement since 2012 the application known as iAHx for the recovery of search results. This is an interface developed by BIREME/PAHO/WHO that shows bibliographic records in an integrated, individualized, typified and ordered manner by different criteria. It includes filters to narrow the search, organization of results by relevance, date, language and email export options, among other features.

WRITING WORKSHOPS

2024

Writing workshops (in development)

The Study Center has been thinking about creating writing workshops in each of the three official languages of the IACFP: English, Spanish and French.

Several colleagues have experience in this type of activity, and we found it useful and enriching to propose such devices to all the therapists in our association.

Couple and family psychoanalysts, whether experienced or beginners, are accustomed to hearing and using the word, both in the course of the therapies they carry out and during professional exchanges, in order to share their practice and care about that of others.

From their initial training and throughout their career, scientific reading provides them with knowledge and feeds their thinking based on the theories, techniques and clinical experiences presented. We also know that everyday personal writing plays a role in the maturation of clinical work, and that professional documents are also necessary in institutional work.

However, each of us may wish to go beyond the usual and present our own views on topics that have captured our interest. In this case, it is about preparing a work that requires the combination of several parameters: The organization of thought is essential for the structure of a text, as is the theoretical coherence and clarity of the clinical presentation. Everyone has their own way of achieving it, and the whole thing improves if it is expressed in polished language. In other words, writing is as much a literary as it is a scientific activity.

Furthermore, the debates have led us to think that the groups would be more harmonious if they developed in the same language. It remains to be decided whether to opt for classic forms of writing workshop or more experiental groups.

In Portugal, the Poïesis association already has a very advanced project aimed at Spanish and Portuguese speaking colleagues.

Liliana Levy (Argentine Association of Linked Psychoanalysis), who has extensive experience in writing workshops, will be the moderator of this first group.

Hana Salaam Abdel-Malek proposes an online experiential workshop, conceived as an analysis of practice.




