PRESENTATION OF THE FIFTH ISSUE

We are pleased to present a new edition of the Psychoanalytic Association for Family and Couples' Weaving newsletter. This edition is intended as a space for resonance, transmission and encounter for individuals reflecting on the themes of bonds, desire and conflict within family and couple relationships.

This issue highlights a series of significant events for our scientific community.

The Newsletter No. 5 is being published at a time of global unrest.

There is the war in Ukraine; the ongoing dehumanizing and dictatorial conflict between the Israeli government and Hamas, affecting populations; the different forms of racism emerging; and the political tensions exposed in disputes between major world powers.

Not to mention the crimes perpetrated by teenagers with knives in schools and colleges.

The relentless advance of environmental degradation – with the devastation of forests, the pollution of the oceans, and the collapse of ecosystem balances – as well as tragic floods such as those in Bahía Blanca, Argentina, confront us with a wounded and fragmented world where symbolic frameworks are eroding and the future is increasingly uncertain. Faced with this situation, psychoanalytic thinking cannot remain indifferent.

We are confronted with violence, helplessness and nameless anguish that manifest in actions, as well as with the imperative to sustain spaces for dialogue, active listening and personal reflection. Against this backdrop, the regional conferences held in Bordeaux and via videoconference for Spanish- and Portuguese-speaking countries, as well as the forthcoming Regional Conference in English, offer invaluable opportunities for clinical, theoretical and human interaction among professionals from various regions, underscoring the strength of collaborative efforts.

We are preparing for the IACFP International Congress, which is set to take place in Mexico in 2026. This event promises to provide a fertile setting for the exchange of clinical and theoretical experiences between colleagues from different regions, in a country whose culture is one of the world's greatest wonders.

Similarly, the activities of the Clinical and Research Groups, which form part of the Study Centre, demonstrate a constant commitment to academic thinking, networking, and creating knowledge in dialogue with clinical experience. These activities continue to contribute to the growth of our field, maintaining rigorous reflection on the complexity of family and couple relationships.



We would also like to acknowledge the valuable contribution of the International Network of Psychoanalytic Journals, which fosters connections between analytical communities worldwide. Through its publications, the network provides access to a wide range of theoretical developments and technical reflections, broadening our horizons and opening up new avenues of research into psychoanalytic practices and approaches. This openness strengthens the epistemic bond between colleagues and helps to preserve psychoanalytic thought in all its plurality, criticality and constant evolution.

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT OF IACFP

We witness in recent times the occurrence of wars and destruction in various parts of the world. Couple and family psychoanalysts, members of the AIPCF, are concerned about the destructiveness that is being acted out in these situations, against children, the elderly, women, entire families in disregard of the ethics that should characterise human relations, the right to autonomy of peoples and international laws. They condemn the invasion of Ukraine and the crimes perpetrated against the Palestinian people by the government of Israel and its prime minister who, in response to the atrocious and sudden attack by Hamas on 7 October 2023, brought death and devastation to a defenceless people. We are aware that the people of Israel do not identify with their government.

Our work with couples and families has shown us many times how fierce and unprocessed traumas carry over into subsequent generations and we are therefore concerned about such transgenerational legacies. The great risk of these traumatizations is the fact that they do not end in the here and now, but enter into the transgenerational chain of memory's transmission, which consists of a crossing, between generations, between psychic spaces, of contents whose elaboration and transformation was not possible. Unfortunately, these memories are maintained in a timeless dimension that is neither modified nor remodelled.

Ferenczi spoke in this regard of "dead clinical fragments", exiled parts of the mind from the conscious and unconscious. They may appear through other languages, through a kind of inscription in the body that represents one of the most primitive vehicles of communication. But everyday actions can also carry these memories, and especially in family groups it becomes an organisational mode of the traumatic links that are transmitted from parent to child and that we can observe in family myths or in the myths of a people. Over time, we have experienced traumas such as genocides and migrations, and it seems to us with astonishment that the product of such traumas is dehumanisation.

We are also convinced of the need to manifest our witness. Freud stated that the psychoanalyst is called upon to be the *Nebenmensch*, the neighbouring human being. The witness of the close human being has a meaning and a strength also with respect to the social pact because it induces one to regain trust in the other, in listening to the other, in the recognition of existence that the other can give you.

For all these reasons the International Association of Couple and Family Psychoanalysis expresses its solidarity with the suffering populations in the hope that medical and food aid can resume in the regions affected by the massacre, and that the release of all hostages can be obtained, restoring human and social rights.

Couples and Families Today Psychoanalysis in the face of new configurations

Couple and family configurations are in constant transformation, influenced by socioeconomic, cultural, and technological factors across different societies. Traditional family models coexist with a diversity of living arrangements, such as single-parent families, blended families, same-sex parent families, and other link configurations. These changes pose new challenges for psychoanalysis, a discipline rooted in understanding the unconscious in human relationships and in the structures of couples and families.



Do processes of culturalization and cultural destruction influence psychic construction and links forms in contemporary society? How should we consider difficulties in the processes of symbolization and sublimation of the death drive and destruction? How do we approach, through psychoanalysis, the changes and transformations in family and couple structures and their manifestation in aspects such as maternal and paternal functions, gender issues, the new roles of men and women in relationships, the recognition of same-sex couples, and reproductive technologies?

What are the consequences of all these transformations on unconscious alliances at intrapsychic, intersubjective, and transsubjective levels? How can we conceptualize these different levels in relation to identificatory networks?

How do we conceive current methods for observing the unconscious in links? How do we reflect from an intersubjective psychoanalysis perspective on the implementation of containment and support therapeutic approaches in extreme situations, such as natural disasters or wars?

This congress offers an opportunity to discuss these topics, share advancements and reflections, and highlight the importance of psychoanalysis in understanding and addressing new family and couple dynamics. At the same time, it underscores the need to contribute to and advance this discipline in light of contemporary developments.

**"Countertransference in Psychoanalytic Work with Couples and Families"
held on June 6 and 7, 2025**

The two half days conference on "Countertransference in Psychoanalytic Couple and Family Work," held on June 6-7, 2025, was organized in collaboration between Tavistock and the International Association for Couples and Family Psychoanalysis (IACFP). It was moderated by Hanni Maan-Shalvi, English Speaking Vice President of IACFP, and Andrew Balfour, CEO of Tavistock. The event brought together some of the leading experts from around the world in the field.

The distinguished speakers included: Anna Maria Nicolò, Jill and David Sharf, Amita Sehgal, Daniela Lucarelli, Elizabeth Palacios, Hanni Mann-Shalvi, Jim Poulton, Tao Lin, Mary Morgan, Monica Vorchheimer, Nestor Kapusta, Tatiana Onikova and Anastasia Tsamparli.

The conference featured keynote lectures, panel sessions, and in-depth discussions held in the afternoon hours, showcasing innovative insights and diverse approaches within psychoanalysis of couples and families. The participants praised the meticulous organization, effective time management, and technological excellence of the event. The engaging discussions offered profound theoretical depth and a wide range of perspectives, contributing to a highly successful and inspiring gathering. Organizers and attendees expressed their enthusiasm for making such events a regular tradition, emphasizing the value of ongoing collaboration and innovation in the field.

This conference offered a deep exploration into the therapist's countertransference as a vital tool for understanding and working with the unconscious dynamics of couples and families. The unique focus lied in addressing how social, cultural, and political contexts shape and influence the couple and the therapeutic process.

**Spanish-Portuguese Conference,
held on March 28 and 29, 2025**

The Hispano-Portuguese Days, held on March 28 and 29, 2025, achieved the objectives set by their organizers – the Hispano-Portuguese Scientific Sub-Commission, coordinated by Ezequiel Jaroslavsky and Manuela Porto, with Pedro Pala de Sá as secretary. These objectives, both scientific and financial, also aimed to foster the integration of all participants into a cohesive and supportive group.

From a scientific standpoint, the Sub-Commission decided that theoretical reflection and integration would be based on clinical material focusing on couples and families.

On March 28, colleagues Carla Mendes and Fernanda Palermo (from Portugal and Brazil) presented a clinical case of a couple, which was then discussed by Elizabeth Palacios (Spain) and Andrea Seixas Magalhães (Brazil), under the chairmanship of Maria Inês Assumpção Fernandes (Brazil). On March 29, Irma Morosini (Argentina) presented a clinical case of a family, discussed by Anna Nicolò (Italy) and Rosa Jaitin (Argentina/France), with the session chaired by Eugénia de Oliveira (Portugal).

Reflections on these cases were deepened in small, randomly formed working groups, promoting active participation and exchange among all attendees.

2025 WORKSHOPS SUMMARIES

The two days concluded with a roundtable. On the first day, it featured Rosina Constante Pereira (Portugal), Lúcia Paiva (Brazil), and Maria Fernanda Rivas (Argentina), chaired by Luis Armando González (Mexico). On the second day, the roundtable included Alberto Eiguer (Argentina/France), Ezequiel Jaroslavsky (Argentina), and Manuela Porto (Portugal), chaired by Pedro Pala de Sá (Portugal).

These days allowed for genuine integration across countries and languages, with a rich, varied, and theoretically diverse shared reflection. Above all, they were marked by numerous expressions of satisfaction from participants, who engaged with one another with enthusiasm and warmth. We warmly thank the Scientific Secretary, Cristina Calarasanu, as well as the IACFP President, Anna Nicolò, for their constant support throughout the preparation and execution of the event.

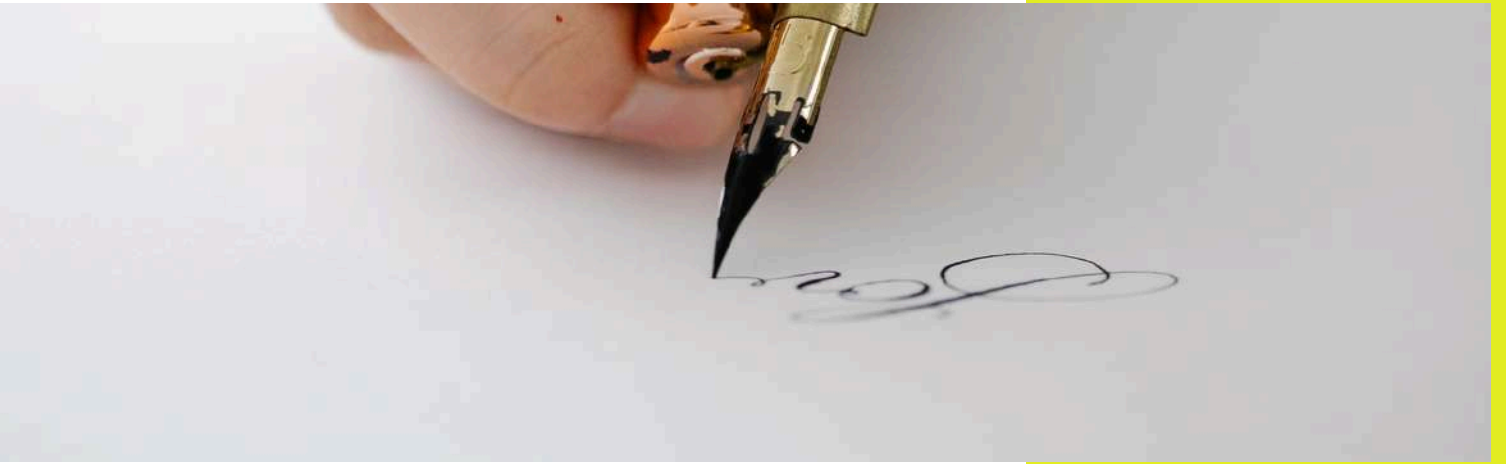

During the first half of 2025, we have been working, thinking and processing together the valuable proposals presented by several of the members for the 2026 Congress. We managed to integrate the various ideas (both in form and content) and decided to raise topics related to relational theory, its logic and founding principles at the Pre-Congress. Following a joint written document, the presentation will be in the form of a discussion.

Our bimonthly meetings have been very well attended, enthusiastic and deliberative, allowing space for debate. Some topics of discussion:

How the conceptualisations of Berenstein and Puget draw on contemporary logics from disciplines such as philosophy, physics, history, biology, sociology and others:

The logic of decentring, of multiplicity (Deleuze); the logic of indeterminacy (quantum physics; uncertainty principle); the logic of becoming; the logic of power relations (Foucault), among others. From these logics emerges the ‘how to’ in practice, both clinical and institutional and social, in politics, in family, group and couple coexistence.

Threesomes: New nominations new realities. Changes in the ways of being a couple (2025)

In the face of the crisis of modern institutions – among them, the couple – we question the existing forms of erotic-affective bonds that are becoming visible in today’s new relational configurations, specifically those formed by three members.

From our working group, composed of professional psychologists, we have been developing a line of research framed within a psychoanalytic relational perspective. Our work focuses on the study of “triejas” (triadic relationships) as a relational configuration that challenges and questions the hegemonic conception of the heterosexual, monogamous couple – a normativized model that has been institutionalized as the only legitimate form of erotic-affective bond oriented toward the formation of a family.

This research aims to reflect on contemporary subjectivation processes and the epochal changes in how people form and experience couples and families. We consider that cultural discourses – transmitted through the social imaginary – have a profound impact on subjective constitution, especially through the transubjective and intersubjective dimensions, as these serve as frameworks that organize what is possible and thinkable in human relationships.

Clinical Working Groups

Through our theoretical and clinical exploration, we seek to explain how these new relational configurations, such as triplets, not only destabilize traditional normative models but also raise questions about the ways in which subjects position themselves in relation to desire, otherness, object choice, and the formation of bonds.

“Social work with couples and families”

Testimony of clinical cases in hospital emergency care of the patient, partner and family group from a psychoanalytic perspective and its translation into medical practice.

Psychoanalysis has expanded its field of application to medicine (cardiovascular surgery, oncology, medical clinic) and, therefore, its professional practice is integrated into the hospital institution, addressing the patient, as well as their partner and family group.

The scandal of trauma and urgency creates tension and prompts us to think of new ways to respond to this subjective suffering. Illness fulfils a function, becoming the solution that the subject has found for an unbearable meaning.

The patient tempers their anxiety with the legitimisation of their organic symptom from a medical perspective and, at the same time, endorses the value of contingency from the dignity of their psychological pain.

Faced with the onset of illness and the doctor's recommendation, the imminence of hospitalisation, surgery or unexpected treatment, and even the proximity of a possible and incalculable death, patients see their routine and their very lives disrupted.

The analyst's listening and the presence of their family group promote the reconstruction of that intrapsychic object in order to reorganise subjective fantasy, sustaining a transitional state that allows the body to be revitalised, investing it with hope in the disorder, with a future and with a resilient recovery.

At the same time, the construction of a dialogue based on dialectical skill, ingenious, creative and creative exchange with the doctor, avoids disciplinary isolation and promotes the integration of our work into the institutional group, emphasising the authority of psychoanalysis and its epistemic legitimacy.

This space for exchange proposes the study of cases based on evidence and questions: What is an emergency? What does this emergency mean for the couple and/or family? How can we move from chaotic emergency to subjective emergency? as sobre lo vincular en la contemporaneidad.

Research Groups

“Research on family and institutional group projective tools” (2025)

Responsible: Almudena SANAHUJA- Magalie BONNET LLOMPART.

As part of our research on family and institutional projective tools, we are developing the FAC (family helping cancer).

This research is led by Almudena Sanahuja (professor at Marie and Louis Pasteur University, Besançon, France) and Magalie Bonnet-Llompарт (professor at Marie et Louis Pasteur University, Besançon, France), whose objective is to identify the impact of the disease on the family group by studying the experience of the disease by different family members and evaluating the family structure and dynamics at different stages of the disease process (from 6 months to less than 3 years after diagnosis). In this context, projective genography and projective family espyography tools are used to study the functioning of the family group, in particular to assess the impact of the disease. The initial results have enabled us to write a first article on the traumatic effects of cancer on the patient and the family group and its members, with repercussions on the family's psychic apparatus in terms of content and container. Based on a paradigmatic clinical example, we have taken a particular interest in families committed to helping, highlighting, through the use of these family projective tools, the repercussions of cancer on the family body and, more specifically, on the “family psychic envelope”.

Research: Interventions and interpretations in couples psychoanalysis

The Spanish-speaking research group, which began in February 2022 under the coordination of Alberto Eiguier, includes among its members Carles Pérez-Testor, Raffaele Fischetti, Lucia Ballelo, Deolinda Costa, Paloma de Pablos, Juan González Rojas, Ana Marques Lito, and Amélia Pimenta, the latter serving as secretary.

Since the last report, sent in June 2024, the research group has held more than four meetings focused on the point of urgency as a working concept in interpretation. The contribution of clinical cases has greatly enriched and stimulated reflection on the central theme of this research: interventions and interpretations.

To identify the point at which to intervene, one must first accept unpredictability. It is also important that the couple therapist is able to question themselves and remain open to reflecting on what the couple brings to the session.

Research Groups

The group dialogue and the clinical cases presented have brought to light themes that are now of great importance and warrant in-depth reflection, such as violence within the couple, the issue of domination and its paralysing and destructive effect on the creativity of the Self, and the question of recognition and non-recognition – all of which can create breaches or voids in the couple's bond. Interventions and interpretations with a positive intention can bring a new nuance to these issues. We concluded the last meeting by discussing the possibility of using humour in interpretative technique, which may serve a rebalancing function in couple therapy.

“Choosing a Relationship in Later Life, Chapter Two: Between Security and Adventure?”

We conducted an exploratory psychoanalytic–narrative study addressing “The process of seeking a new romantic relationship in later life.” We interviewed 12 women and men aged between 65 and 75.

We found that, alongside feelings of difficulty and anxiety, the longing to fall in love – to feel “butterflies in the stomach” – emerged as a central motivation for remaining engaged in the search. We observed that the sensation of falling in love, which may develop from the paranoid-schizoid position, involving regression and fantasy, also serves as a platform for enhancing vitality – something particularly significant in later life. However, building a stable and lasting relationship requires acting from the depressive position.

The main conclusion of our research is that the capacity to move between mental positions creates the opportunity to find and build a new romantic relationship in later life.

WRITING WORKSHOP FOR PSYCHOANALYSTS

During the month of February of this year, we held four meetings with colleagues from different countries, coordinated by Lic. Luis Armando González from Mexico and Lic. Liliana Levy from Argentina.

The proposal promoted by the Aicpf was to hold a workshop we called "Writing, a Laboratory of the Possible." The objective was to explore the diverse possibilities that language can offer psychoanalysts who intend to write on the subject: an essay, a clinical case, a theoretical development...

This is how we were able to form a group with participants from different countries: Mónica Rayas, Dorys, Pedro Camacho, Hilda Navarro, Marcela Iszugut, Claudia Abalos, Sandra Hernandez, Patricia Alcalde, Margarita Berdugo, Daniel Guzman.

Together, we briefly reviewed literary genres, focusing on central themes for producing an essay: "fiction," "verisimilitude," "grammatical rules," "the relationship between psychoanalysis and literature," and others. We included readings of texts published in journals related to relational psychoanalysis and proposed writing prompts that were reviewed week by week. These prompts were then discussed with the group in a discussion session during the sessions.

It was important to be able to identify the obstacles, fantasies, and problems faced by every subject willing to write, considering the subjective implications that the literary exercise promotes.

Among the many shared reflections, we are left with the imprint of a dynamic group experience in which the basic trust essential for exploring each other's potential and renewing the enthusiasm necessary to embark on the adventure of writing was able to circulate.

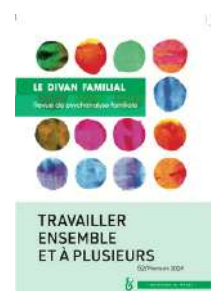
